Taking into consideration:

1. 2. The Law 4914/2022 "Management, control and implementation of development interventions for the Programming Period 2021-2027, establishment of a Public Company "National Register of Young Enterprises S.A." and other provisions" (A' 61) and in particular articles 11 par. 9 and 63 par. 29 thereof;

#### Financing Activities located outside the programme area

The Programme area covers geographical areas in the two participating countries as above. In principle, all activities of a project should take place within the Programme area. If a project plans to finance activities or events outside the programme area, this is possible in the context of cooperation Programmes. Exceptions to this principle may be granted for EU partners from outside the Programme area in duly justified cases.

If activities (including travel and accommodation) and/ or events are planned outside the programme area, the following conditions need to be satisfied:

- the activity and/ or event are for the benefit of the Programme area;
- the activity and/ or event are essential for the implementation of the project;
- the implementation and/ or the relevance of the activity and/ or the event have been approved by the Programme beforehand (foreseen in the Application Form or, if not, have been previously authorised by the MA/JS).

Infrastructure located outside the Programme area, even if it is directly related to the project either for the development or for implementation, shall not be eligible.

## 2. BUDGET OF THE CALL

The Programme will allocate approximately **5.781.500,00 EUR** (EU & National Funds) to the present Call for Project Proposals. The EU contribution rate is 80%. The 20 % national co-financing for Bulgarian beneficiaries is ensured from the state budget. Beneficiaries shall ensure the needed own contribution (public and/or private), if applicable.

An indicative budget allocation (EU & National Funds) to the programme priorities and to the specific objectives is presented in Annex I – Table 2. In the context of the present Call, projects will be included up to the amount of the budget of the Call. When selecting projects to be funded, such allocation may be adapted by the Monitoring Committee (MC) according to programme needs. Projects may be selected up to **100%** of the budget of the present Call for Project Proposals, if deemed necessary.

## 3. CONTEXT OF THE CALL

The present Call concerns the Targeted Project foreseen, in the Programme Document, to capitalise the results and possible territorial expansion of the operation of the 2014-2020 project FLOOD GUARD: Increasing the capacity to respond to disasters and emergencies in the cross-border region of Bulgaria and Greece.

The programme area is sensitive to climate related natural disasters. It is highly vulnerable to floods, landslides, forest fires and heatwaves. Socio-economic, health, and environmental impacts are significant and threaten the local communities. Climate Change Adaptation has territorial aspects that know no administrative borders. The aim of the specific objective is to improve resilience of ecosystems and communities to the effects of climate change and enhance cross-border risk prevention and response mechanisms. The focus is on river valleys that are susceptible to overflows of their flood bed in times of heavy rainfall, mountain areas facing landslides or threatened by forest fires during the hot and dry season and cities affected by urban heat and dust.

Therefore, the Interreg VI-A Greece-Bulgaria programme 2021-2027 will support, through the present Call, cross border cooperation to enhance capacities for an effective climate resilience and adaptation. As climatic phenomena and effects do not know borders, the main aim of the Targeted Project is to enhance through cooperation a territorial integrated approach. Cooperation fields can include both managerial (including information exchange and security plans) and infrastructure actions.

More specifically, through present Call, may be funded activities such as (indicatively):

- Cooperation plans, protocols, infrastructures, and equipment for effective risk treatment, including digital solutions.

Expected results of the proposed Project:

Cooperation actions should increase the (technical and administrative) capacity for more efficient and timely response to different types of natural disasters. Equipment should improve the effectiveness of immediate and targeted respond to disasters and emergencies (limiting the exposure of the population).

CBC Added Value / synergies with other forms of support: Confrontation of Climatic risk is a common challenge The Cooperation activities and joint initiatives will support the interoperability of national systems and better coordination in prevention, control and improved response to natural disasters and therefore enhance the effectiveness. Cooperation will motivate organisational and policy learning processes and more improved efficiency.

## 4. PROJECT DURATION

Projects should be concluded within a maximum period of thirty six (36) months after the signing of the Subsidy Contract (SC) between the Managing Authority/ Special Secretary for ERDF & CF and the Lead Beneficiary. Projects that have started their implementation before the signing of the contract, and in any case after 1/1/2021, should not have been concluded before the application for funding at the present Call for Project Proposals.

This limit applies for the operative phase of the project and does not include the preparation phase.

## 5. ELIGIBILITY OF PARTNERSHIPS

The project partnersheme consists of the Beneficiaries who are invited by Present Call

In line with Article 2(9) of the CPR, beneficiaries are responsible for initiating and/or implementing projects. They shall cooperate in the development and implementation of operations, as well as in the staffing or financing of operations, or both in accordance with Article 23(4) of the ETC Regulation.

## 6. ELIGIBILITY OF EXPENDITURE

6.1. The end date of the eligibility period for the costs of the proposed operations is defined as 31.12.2029. The end date of the proposed projects (completion in both physical and financial terms of the project) should be by the above date.

6.2. Projects that have been physically completed or fully executed before the application for funding at the present Call for Project Proposals are not eligible, regardless of whether or not the related payments have been made.

### 6.3. Project budget requirements (incl. EU & National Funds)

The maximum budget of the submitted project proposal is defined as the amount of 5.781.500,00 €.

### 6.4. Partners budget requirements (incl. EU & National Funds)

No budget limit applies per project partner

### 6.5. Associated Partners budget requirements (incl. EU & National Funds)

Not applicable

6.6. The ERDF co-financing to beneficiaries may be reduced in case of State aid relevance of project activities, in compliance with relevant rules on State aid (see PPIM). In such a case State aid is granted under the *de minimis* regime & *GBER* within the project.

6.7. The MA may modify the total amount of the public expenditure of the present Call or may proceed with a justified termination of the validity of the Call, informing in any case the beneficiaries through the programme website

6.8. The eligibility rules for the costs of the co-financed operations are specified in Programme and Project Implementation Manual.

The beneficiaries may select to be financed either on real costs or on flat rate as follows.

The simplified cost options applied to the projects will not be able to be modified either during its implementation or upon its completion.

For all expenses that will be reimbursed using the simplified cost option, Beneficiaries will not provide paid receipts of expenses or documents of equivalent accounting value maintained in the Beneficiary's accounting system.

**Note:** Direct costs for the calculation of the above amount of Staff Cost, are defined as the sum of the costs of the budget lines "external expertise and services", "equipment" and "infrastructure and works" costs of the beneficiary's budget. Travel and accommodation budget category is not included in the direct costs.

6.11. Costs within the budget lines "staff costs, travel and accommodation costs and external expertise and services", which have been incurred for the preparation of the project, are eligible for funding on a real cost basis calculation, but should not exceed the amount of €30.000 at project level.

6.12. The management costs of each project beneficiary should not exceed 10% of the its total budget. For the Lead Beneficiary this percentage shall be limited to 15% of its budget.

6.13. Communication' costs cannot exceed the 150.000€, without limits at beneficiary level

6.14. The Office and Administration costs cannot exceed the 4% of the total beneficiary's budget in both reimbursement option.

Detailed eligibility rules on activities and related expenditure are described in the Programme and Project Implementation Manual.

## 7. INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE SUBMISSION OF PROJECT PROPOSALS/CONCEPT NOTES

7.1. The project proposal will be submitted via MIS with reference on present Call for Project Proposal, at the following website <https://logon.ops.gr/>

from **May 29<sup>th</sup> 2024** (start date for submission of proposals), time **09.00** Eastern European Time (EET) until, exclusively, **July 31<sup>st</sup> 2024** (deadline for submission of proposals), time **15.00** Eastern European Time (EET)

by the Lead Beneficiary's legal representative (personal user account of the legal representative).

After the successful submission of the proposal, the Beneficiaries are informed about it through the MIS.

Before the deadline for submitting proposals, it is allowed to resubmit a new proposal after canceling the original proposal. The proposal is evaluated based on the last successful/valid submission.

The beneficiaries are required to have two types of personal user accounts (username and password) to access the MIS:

1. the Beneficiaries's officers to fill in the forms and
2. the Lead Beneficiary's legal representative for submitting proposals, or another user of the system authorized for submission.

If the Beneficiaries does not already have a "Body Code" in the MIS from the period 2014-2020, should apply for a body code. Instructions for obtaining a Body Code and/or User Account in MIS can be found at Applicant's Package Annexes 16,17.

- 7.2. The Application Form (AF) is the Beneficiary's proposal and is completed exclusively in the electronic format available at the MIS. Instructions for filling in the fields of the Application Form are attached to the present Call (Annex 16)  
The submission of proposal also constitutes an application for funding of the potential beneficiaries
- 7.3. The legal documents that prove the Administrative and Financial capability, the authority/competency of the beneficiaries for the implementation of the activities of the specific Project, the regulatory framework for the designation of the body responsible for the operation and maintenance of the Project, the existence and operation of a Branch (if applicable), are required for the evaluation of the project proposal and must be attached to the each Beneficiary's Profile in the "Utilities" section/8.1. Project Bodies Information of the MIS.

Beneficiaries are obliged to fully complete and attach all the required legal documents by the proposal submission deadline.

## 8. SELECTION PROCESS

After the submission of the proposal by the potential Beneficiary, the selection process and approval of projects is as follows.

Phase B1: Administrative & Project Eligibility Assessment

Phase B2a: Quality Assessment

Phase B2b: Beneficiaries Eligibility Check & State Aid Compliance for Project Proposals which have been positively evaluated in phases B1 and B2a

The evaluation of the proposals (Quality Assessment) is performed by two (2) Assessors from the MA/JS and the evaluation procedure is under the control and responsibility of Unit A of the MA.

During the evaluation, the MA/JS may request from the beneficiary, (B1 & B2 Phase) to submit additional information and clarifications, within a specific deadline.

The results of the evaluation (Phases B1, B2a, B2b) are approved by the Monitoring Committee and communicated by the Managing Authority to the Lead Partner of each partnership, via MIS or e-mail.

In response to the above decision, complaints can be raised by potential Lead Partners, which may be submitted within 7 working days from the next day after the communication of the Monitoring Committee's Decision.

Complaints are examined by the Joint Complaints Committee, based on its rules of procedure approved by the Monitoring Committee. The findings of the Joint Complaints Committee are communicated to the Monitoring Committee, which takes the final decision on the complaints submitted.

In case a complaint is accepted and there is a need to modify the results of the initial evaluation, this modification is validated by the Monitoring Committee.

After the completion of the above procedure, a technical meeting is held between MA/JS and the partnership scheme, where the financial scope of each project is finalized, if required, and the subsidy contract is signed.

## 10. PERSONAL DATA PROTECTION

10.1. The Managing Authority that holds the position of "controller" declares that:

- is aware of the provisions of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, the Hellenic Legislation - Law 4624/2019 and the relevant instructions and decisions of the Hellenic Data Protection Authority, which govern the legal execution of the Call, and
- fully undertakes the obligations deriving from the legislation, regarding the protection and security of personal data, which may be processed and/or come to its knowledge in any way.

10.2. The processing by the beneficiaries (acting as processors) is governed by a legal act that falls under the European Union law and the Hellenic law, which binds the processor in relation to the controller and determines the object and duration of the processing, the nature and purpose of the processing, the type of personal data and the categories of data subjects, as well as the obligations and rights of the controller and the processors. This legal act, takes the form of the Subsidy Contract between the Managing Authority and the Lead Beneficiary (Lead Partner) of a project - following the Decision of the Monitoring Committee, where all the provisions related to the protection of personal data are provided.
